Dear Ms Hade,

I refer to your recent request under the Freedom of Information Act 2014 for access to records as follows:

I wish to be furnished with details in relation to education and training programmes offered to staff within the department from January 1, 2016, to date.

This should include the following details:

- A list of external training providers
- Total expenditure on training for the Department
- Expenditure in relation to education programmes covered under Refund of Fees
- A narrative on the range of courses
- Total number of staff in the Department

I refer also to the acknowledgement of your request which was sent to you on the 24th May.

I have identified three records that fall within the scope of your request. The records are listed in the schedule below.

The Department runs an extensive training programme using in-house experts and, when required, external providers. Training provided at HQ includes induction programmes; leadership and management training; development training; audit and risk assessment; communications skills training; negotiations skills training; health and safety training as well as training on passport and consular services; foreign policy issues and briefings on personal and Mission security.

In addition to language training, the Department provides its officers with a comprehensive pre-posting training programme in advance of taking up their duties in our Missions overseas.

A proportion of the training budget is spent in Missions abroad, largely on language training provided by local suppliers.

In 2016, all newly recruited AO/Third Secretaries in the Department participated in the Civil Service wide Graduate Development Programme run by the Department of Public Expenditure & Reform.

The Department currently has a total of 1,529 staff approximately. This figure includes 351 local staff based abroad. In addition, the Department currently has 216 Temporary Clerical Officers working in the Passport Offices.
