Dear Mr O'Dwyer,

I refer to the request which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014 for access to records held by this Department, as follows:

All briefing notes and documents relating to the EU External Action Service in the context of expanding Ireland's diplomatic footprint.

All correspondence between Secretary General Niall Burgess and the minister of the day (i.e. Min Simon Coveney or Minister Charlie Flanagan) in relation to the EU External Action Service from September 1, 2016 to August 30, 2017.

I refer also to the acknowledgement of your request which was sent to you on 21 September 2017.

As no records falling within the scope of your request have been identified, your request falls for refusal under Section 15 (1)(a) of the FOI Act, that is, the record concerned does not exist or cannot be found after all reasonable steps to ascertain its whereabouts have been taken.

## **Right of Appeal**

You should make your appeal within 4 weeks (20 working days) from the date of this notification. However, the making of a late appeal may be permitted in appropriate circumstances. The appeal will involve a complete reconsideration of the matter by a more senior member of the staff of this Department.
