## Consulate General of Ireland, Atlanta February 2016 Newsletter

## **Irish News**

The President and Taoiseach today signed the papers to dissolve the Dáil and initiate a February 26 <u>election</u>. This will be one of the shortest general election campaigns in the history of the State.

<u>Government accounts</u> for 2015 showed that total Irish Tax revenue was  $\notin$  3.3 billion ahead of expectations. The latest <u>unemployment figures</u> show that the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for January 2016 was 8.6%, the lowest rate in seven years.

Ireland and Britain mourned the passing of broadcaster <u>Terry Wogan</u> on 31 January.

Irish Aid, Ireland's national development agency, will provide  $\in$  9.1 in emergency relief funding to drought-struck Ethiopia.

The inaugural European Financial Forum was held in Dublin on January 27 to bring together decision-makers to debate the issues facing the European and global financial services sector. See the Taoiseach's <u>address</u>.

Ireland's new <u>National Skills Strategy 2025</u> will establish a National Skills Council to oversee research, forecasting and prioritisation of skills needs in the economy and will increase support for apprenticeships.

The Taoiseach and Minister for Foreign Affairs and Trade attended Ireland's National Holocaust Memorial Commemoration on January 22.

Global Atlanta published Consul General Stephens's review of <u>Vivid Faces: The</u> <u>Revolutionary Generation in Ireland 1890-1923 by R.F. Foster</u> in January. On April 14 Prof. Foster will deliver the keynote address at the <u>ACIS Conference</u> on Pre-Revolutionary Ireland at Georgia State University. This will be open to the public.
