Dear Tadhg,

I refer to the request which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014 for access to records held by this Department, as follows:

Records created after 23 June 2016 relating to meetings between the Minister for Foreign Affairs on the one hand, and representatives of the soi-dissant Loyalist Community Council, Ulster Defence Association, Ulster Volunteer Force and/or Red Hand Commando, or, in the alternative, a list of such meetings with dates, location of meetings, agendas and people attending

I refer also to the acknowledgement of your request which was sent to you on 4 November 2019.

I have identified nine records that fall within the scope of your request. The records are listed in the schedule attached. I have made a decision to grant/part-grant three of the records. Where access has been refused, the records are exempt from release under sections 29; 33; 35; 37.

In the interests of promoting peace and reconciliation across this island, the Government engages, at political and official level, with a broad range of stakeholders across all communities in Northern Ireland.

## Right of Appeal
