Dear Requester,

I refer to the request which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014 for access to records held by this Department, as follows:

'I would be obliged if you would let me know for each of the (available) last three years: Grants, etc., payable to each of the following or any organisations under their control: 1. UNFPA 2. International Planned Parenthood Federation. Distinction should be made between: ex gratia grants and, other grants and payments for services rendered. Amounts estimated to be less than €5,000 for an organisation in the year can be disregarded.'

I refer also to the acknowledgement of your request which was sent to you on January 31, 2019.

Other than the most recent figures from 2018, the information you have requested is in the public domain, i.e., the Irish Aid Annual Reports. Information on the funding provided by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade to the organisations listed in your request can be found below.

<u>UNFPA</u>

The Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade provides support to UNFPA mainly through core funding to UNFPA Headquarters as well as through bilateral partnerships at country level. The total contribution to UNFPA per year for the last three years is:

The Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade does not provide direct funding to the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF). We do, however, provide funding to their European Network Member Association, the Irish Family Planning Association as noted below:
