I have identified one record that falls within the scope of your request. The record is listed in the schedule attached. I have made a decision to part-grant the record.

Where access has been refused, the records are exempt from release under sections 28 (1) (a) of the Freedom of Information Act 2014.

I am refusing elements of this record under Section 28 (1) (a) as these are listings of Government Memoranda, which have been or are proposed to be submitted to the Government for consideration by the Cabinet and were created for that purpose.
