To Whom to Concerns

I refer to your recent application under the Freedom of Information Acts 1997 & 2003 to the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade for access to records as follows:

Copies of all correspondence between the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade and any other Irish Government department, Non-Governmental Organisation, public body or charity, in respect of any proposal to require that tobacco products are sold in standard or plain packs, including without limitation the proposed measures contained in the General Scheme of the Public Health (Standardised Packaging of Tobacco) Bill 2013 since 1 January 2012.

Copies of all minutes/notes of meetings and telephone calls between the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade and any other Irish Government department, Non-Governmental Organisation, public body or charity, in respect of any proposal to require that tobacco products are sold in standard or plain packs, including without limitation the proposed measures contained in the General Scheme of the Public Health (Standardised Packaging of Tobacco) Bill 2013 since 1 January 2012.

I have identified 22 records which fall within the scope of your request. These records are listed in the attached schedule. I have made a decision to refuse access to all records under Sections 24(1) and (2)(c) – international relations, diplomatic communications - and 46 - a record held by the Office of the Attorney General - of the FOI Act.

Other records relating to this request may be held by the Department of Job, Enterprise and Innovation (D/JEI) official at Ireland's Permanent Mission to the United Nations, Geneva (PMUN

Geneva). I understand that a separate request has been made by your office to D/JEI for access to such records.

Right of Appeal

Should you wish to appeal this decision, you may do so in writing to the Freedom of Information Unit, Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, 76-78 Harcourt Street, Dublin 2. You should make your appeal within 4 weeks (20 working days) from the date of this notification. However, the making of a late appeal may be permitted in appropriate circumstances. The appeal will involve a complete reconsideration of the matter by a more senior member of the staff of this Department.
